

IFDA All-Ireland Championships Bid Guidelines



This document outlines the basic requirements expected of an applicant to host an All-Ireland Championship event.

Bid documentation (what to put in the bid!):

- Number of pitches available
- Personnel responsible for bid (at least TD, preferably group of organisers)
- Estimated entrance fee
- Estimated tournament budget
- Food options available
- Accommodation options available

Before the Event:

- Early & consistent communication with both the target audience and the IFDA Tournaments Coordinator (or a member of the IFDA Committee)
- Deliver both the Schedule and Captains Pack to all captains at least 5 days before the tournament begins

At the Event:

- Playable and clearly marked pitches
- Provide a supply of free water
- Provide trophies and/or medals as appropriate
- Provide a Spirit Award based on WFDF Spirit Score sheets after each game
- Provide a variety of accommodation options
- Food*

After the event:

- Publish financial accounts on tournament web site or irishultimate.com
- Publish a full set of the results on tournament web site or irishultimate.com
- Publish all Spirit scores on tournament web site or irishultimate.com

* Food is not a mandatory requirement. The budget should reflect the presence or absence thereof.

To facilitate as many teams as possible entering the All-Ireland Championships, entrance fees should be kept as low as possible. The IFDA requests that organisers work with a profit margin of no greater than 30%.

Knowledge of these requirements are intended to make a hosts job easier and to ensure an ever improving standard of championships. The IFDA committee are keen to work with all prospective hosts to provide the best tournaments possible for all involved.
